

Magic refers to two aspects within the charity, first; the work that goes into running the events, fundraising and projects is magic. Hosting our first Charity luncheon for the Animal Welfare League Queensland (AWLQ) was one of the most exciting things in 2022. When I had to opportunity to talk at the lunch, I told a story about the time I was in Hobart, Tasmania. My partner and I were walking down one of the most well-known streets of Hobart. We were talking about our day and what we might do tomorrow, when we noticed a man and his dog sitting on the path. This sight is all too common around the world but one thing we noticed was who was warmer. It was an extremely cold night and yet a large warm blanket wasn't pulled tightly around the man's shoulders. It was wrapped around the dog. In that moment I realised that to the majority of us, our animals are more important than ourselves. I realised that if we want to fix the animal homelessness crisis, we need to look no further than pet owners. I am looking forward to continuing our work with the AWLQ and strengthen our relationship to better support our animals.

One of our biggest focuses here at Magic Ant Network, is connection. During this year we formed several new relationships. One of those relationships was with SANDBAG. This organisation is one of a kind and an incredible group. When we attended the RizzeUp Luncheon, we were joined by Lana, SANDBAGs Women's Counsellor. The very next day our team was lucky enough to attend a collaboration by SANDBAG, Green P Farm and Brisbane Rape & Incest Survivors Support Centre (BRISSC). This event centred around Truth, Healing and Reconciliation. It was an informative and welcoming event that left the team with lots to think about. Continuing the relationship with SANDBAG is one of my biggest goals of 2023.

Going into 2023 we are hoping to form many more partnerships with businesses, schools, council and charities. Working with these organisations is what will help us move towards a better world and our hope is that with greater collaboration, we can see real change.

We also send our love to those in NSW who continued to experience flooding throughout the year.

We as an organisation don't believe the Brisbane City Council Lord Mayor responded to the flooding event in a timely fashion. This led us to go out by ourselves to clean and aid in the recovery. The day after the water receded, we took to the street with our Clean Ant Saturday cleaning equipment and began cleaning the local area. We stopped and talked to residence along the way and were saddened to hear all that was lost.

Joining with the team organised by Cr Jared Cassidy, our team continued to help where we could. Magic Director Lachlan went to several houses in the area to assist with the clean up and he noticed one thing. "Everyone wanted to help. No job was too big or too small. It showed that even in the darkest of times, the light can shine through. I am proud to be a member of this community".

This event led to our team committing to creating a Disaster Relief plan. This plan will allow our organisation and others to aid in the recovery effort immediately. It will help communities have hope for better days. We look forward to working with Council in 2023 to make this plan a reality.
